



SIERRA LEONE SAFE WATER PROJECT

Antipollution supports the Sierra Leone Safe Water Project in Kono district which focuses on providing clean water by restoring boreholes and promoting good sanitation. These measures combine to prevent contamination and reduce the need for firewood, helping to conserve forests and decrease the time spent on collecting water and firewood, particularly benefiting women and children.

The project's performance is regularly monitored by conducting community surveys, reviewing financial records, and conducting site visits to assess the boreholes' functionality and water quality. The project team also engages with stakeholders, including the government, local communities and NGOs to receive feedback and incorporate suggestions into the project's design and implementation.
